3. Discuss formal requirements of an Arbitration Agreement according to UNCITRAL Model Convention, model arbitration clause and related judicial pronouncements in this regard.
4. "Arbitral seat" or "place of arbitration" is a legal construct, not a geographic location". Critically analyse.
