8. Smitha, a four-year old girl, is carried off by a street dog. Mathew fires at the dog. However, the bullet hit on Smitha and she suffered a grave injury. Discuss the liability of Mathew.
9. Sudhi instigates Thomas to murder Sathyam. Thomas refuses to do so. Whether Sudhi can be held liable for any offence. Explain with the help of relevant provisions.
10. Raju puts a bait for dogs in his pocket, and this induces Joseph's dog to follow it. The dog went with Raju. Whether Raju committed any offence ? Discuss.
