10. X and Y both Hindus, exchanged garlands in a temple before their friends and declared themselves to be husband and wife. They lived for next 3 years. Then X married Z following traditional ceremonies of a Hindu marriage including Saptapathi. Can X be prosecuted for bigamy ? Decide.
