9. K filed an execution petition, and based on that, an attachment of a land order was issued. Subsequently, the petition was dismissed on account of default on the part of the decree-holder. Discuss its effect on the attachment order based on the relevant provisions in CPC.
10. Mr. L filed an application for restitution of suit properties in terms of the arbitral award. Mr. M filed a writ petition challenging the arbitral award. However, both parties, during the pendency of the writ petition, reached a settlement through conciliation proceedings as per Section 89 of CPC. Decide the application for restitution.
